LKOC BEAUTIFICATION PROJECTS IN KAILUA

The Lani-Kailua Outdoor Circle (LKOC) has been installing and maintaining beautification projects in public spaces around Kailua since its founding as a branch of the Outdoor Circle in 1948.

Since 2010, LKOC has been maintaining the two traffic triangles at either end of Kalaheo Avenue, one at Pali Palms, and the other at Kalapawai. Not only did LKOC fund the design and construction of the landscaping, it currently pays for the on-going professional maintenance of those plantings, including all irrigation repair. In 2019, we completed a landscape refurbishment of Alala Point, overlooking Kailua Beach. In 2020, we are planning a street tree replanting project on Oneawa Street, from Kuulei Road to Kawainui Street. Visit our website www.lkoc.org to learn more about these projects.

Since 1999, LKOC has been funding the **Community Service Workline** from the Women's Community Correctional Center (WCCC), providing teams of inmates who maintain the landscaping at numerous public areas in Windward Oahu, including Kawainui Marsh, Pohakupu Park, Kaha Field, the central median coming in to Kailua and the extensive landscaping at Alala Point. LKOC provides their training, equipment, and equipment repair.

In 2007, in partnership with the City and County of Honolulu, LKOC took on the project of replanting the median on Mokapu Boulevard with Shower and Narra trees, between North Kalaheo Avenue and Marine Corp Base Hawaii.

LKOC EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH PROJECTS ON THE WINDWARD SIDE

Since 2008, LKOC has sponsored the "**Learning to Grow**" program at the **Women's Community Correctional Center** (WCCC), teaching inmates horticultural skills, as well as small business, financial and life skills they can use upon release. Hydroponic lettuce they grow at the facility is now sold at Foodland stores across Oahu, where all proceeds go to support the program. Our LKOC volunteers mentor the women in the program (volunteering 2-3 times a week), and we hire instructors to teach a series of 6-week classes throughout the year. Over 300 women have participated to date.

Since 1993, LKOC has been providing annual **scholarship** funds in agriculture and environmental studies for students at **Windward Community College** (WCC). More than 80 students to date have received these scholarships. LKOC is proud to provide this opportunity to the next generation of stewards of our 'aina.
